If you are one of the 224 families who "Invested in Excellence" during the 2017-2018 school year or are one of the over 50 families who invests each month, your gifts and giving spirit have made two huge impacts on our school and students!

The Student Commons at the HS opened on the first day of school and our students adopted it immediately, no questions asked, from minute number one of the first period, on the first day of school. At any given moment before, during and after the school day you will find 20+ students quietly studying, working together and socializing. Intended to be a comfortable space that encourages collaboration with a coffee house vibe, the Commons has flexible, cushy seating for 25, power to charge laptops and mobile devices and two coffee machines. A vestibule to the school was also constructed as part of project for added security.

At the Media Center in the MS, teachers and students were welcomed back with a state of the art production room and a digital citizenship classroom. Both are in use nearly constantly and both spaces support our mission of teaching 40 hours of digital citizenship to all MS students by the time they complete 8th grade and encouraging learning by doing - creating and collaborating. These upgrades demonstrate what is possible for our students when the school and our families partner together.

MS Gets New Furniture for Students

Last fall it became apparent that it was time for a refresh of our classroom furniture at the MS. Some of the MS desks and chairs had been serving our students since the school began in 1998 and came to us "used" even then! Knowing that desks and chairs for 800 students would be a huge financial outlay and the furniture decided upon could be with us for another 20 years, a pilot made sense. Thanks to the generosity of parents who "Invest in Excellence" we were able to order several different types of classroom furniture, from the traditional desk/seat combo to the most modern options available, and let our teachers experiment. They then selected what they felt would work best for their style of teaching and subject matter. The new furniture arrived over the summer and was waiting for our students on the first day of school. Although the colors and styles range the gamut, the one thing it all has in common is flexibility. With these flexible seating arrangements, students might have the opportunity to be able to work alone or as a group, remain stationary, sit, stand, wiggle and spin! Of course, all of this will be happening in a manner that will encourage students do their best work.

If the early dismissal is for a medical appointment, the student should bring a note from the medical professional to the office the next day for the absence to be considered excused. HS students who drive themselves to school must bring a note signed by the parent, including a contact number for the parent, to the office before school begins. A dismissal slip will be issued to the student after the parent has been contacted and the early dismissal has been verified. To preserve the integrity of the classroom environment, early dismissals will end at 2:15pm at the HS, 2:30pm at the MS and 3:00pm at the ES. Please schedule appointments accordingly and be mindful that students will not be dismissed after these times.

Student Absences

An absence is defined as missing half of any class period or more. For every absence, students must bring a note from home stating the student's name, date(s) of absence, reason for absence, and parent/guardian signature. Notes for ES students may be emailed or given to the child's teacher and the front office. At the MS, these notes are to be given to the student's first period teacher during the morning. HS students should deliver these notes to the main office before school. It will be the responsibility of the administration to determine if the absence is excused or unexcused. Students must bring in a note or have an e-mail sent by their parent/guardian for their absence to be considered excused.
