

Board of Education Member

Board of Education members have the collective responsibility for hiring and evaluating the Superintendent, setting the vision and goals for the school, overseeing adoption of school vision and goals to ensure key school performance metrics are being achieved, adopting policies that give the school administration direction to set priorities and achieve its goals, adopting and overseeing the annual budget and financial matters, evaluating and decisioning on escalated school matters, and advocating for the charter school and school community.

Board members may serve in an Officer position (Chair, Vice Chair, Treasurer, Secretary) or as a Committee Chair or Committee member on one or more of the Board's standing committees (Budget and Finance, Investment, Audit and Evaluation, Governance) or strategic committees ([THRIVE](#), Future Ready). Service on the Board of Education requires a time commitment as well as some prior knowledge and/or skill in particular disciplines.

The Board member position is a three-year term. A Board member can serve for a total of two complete terms.

Skillset and Qualifications:

- Has proven experience in strategic Executive leadership and/or Board leadership positions
- Thinks independently, critically and logically to make informed and fact-based decisions in the best interest of the school
- Displays strong diplomatic and interpersonal skills, with the ability to effectively collaborate, manage conflict and influence across stakeholder groups
- Demonstrates strong verbal and written communication skills
- Acts ethically, including maintaining objectivity and fairness to serve the best interests of the school as a whole
- Discloses any potential conflicts of interest to the Board Chair and Vice Chair
- Acts with discretion and maintains confidentiality related to sensitive school matters
- Displays knowledge of meeting procedures, decision-making rules, governance policies and the bylaws of the organization
- Demonstrates strong organizational and time management skills
- Contributes financially based on personal means to achieve 100% Board participation in school fundraising campaigns
- Displays the commitment, energy and passion to support LNC's mission and goals particularly related to the THRIVE strategic committee.
- Experienced in a Board officer position at a non-profit or school organization (preferred)
