

Plan B – Hybrid Learning Environment/Less Students Physically Present at School to Allow Social Distancing

Applies To All Schools

- All <u>Health & Safety Protocols</u> followed.
- Social and Emotional Support in place.
- To limit the density, an altered schedule is implemented with students separated into two cohorts, each attending in-person school 2 days a week.
 - Cohort 1 Schedule
 - Monday/Thursday In-person learning at school
 - Tuesday/Friday Remote learning from home
 - Wednesday Student Seminar
 - Cohort 2 Schedule
 - Tuesday/Friday In-person learning at school
 - Monday/Thursday Remote learning from home
 - Wednesday Student Seminar
 - o Both cohorts participate in a Student Seminar each Wednesday. See examples under school specific information.
 - As a rule, students with last names beginning A-La comprise Cohort 1 and students with last names beginning Le-Z comprise Cohort 2. Special circumstances causing deviation include 1) families who have children with different last names or 2) LNC's need to better balance classes.
- All students and staff (K-12) required to wear a facial covering/mask that covers their
 nose and mouth. Students and staff may remove masks during lunchtime and potentially
 other times when mask breaks can safely be conducted as directed by their teacher.
 Please note that face shields are not a substitute for masks.
- No large group assemblies.
- Students in grades K-8 kept within their same classroom group to limit exposure with those students transitioning together for activities outside of classroom, i.e., restrooms, recess and specials/electives.
- Desks and tables within classrooms will be spread out or have physical barriers to allow for social distancing.

- Classrooms contain designated "teacher-only" areas to allow for social distancing between the teacher and students as much as possible. Teachers will always wear a mask when working in close proximity with students.
- For electives/specials such as physical education, band and chorus, curriculum and assessments will be modified to minimize risk of exposure. Parents will be notified of those modifications from the teacher regarding the specific course.
- One-way hallways implemented in all schools to minimize faceto-face encounters.
- Lunches eaten in the classroom.
- Students bring their own water bottles as water fountains will be closed, bottle-filling stations open.
- Designated PTO members deliver catered lunches to classrooms utilizing all protocols.
- Volunteering limited to only essential needs, following all Health & Safety Protocols.
